Children; Humbert 33, card tender Fay 26, spinner

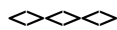
Buried in the [Glendale Community Cemetery](#);

Pierce Gault, son of Sidney and Harriette Burgess Gault;

The 1940 Census records show that he was a 75 year old patient in the Spartanburg County Home.

No other records were found.

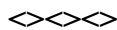


Rev. W. Lester Gault, son of Rev. Sidney and Harriette Burgess Gault;

The Family of Alonzo W. Gault, son of Rev. Sidney and Harriette Burgess Gault

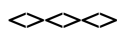

The Family of Mae Gault Holt Hellams, daughter of Rev. Sidney and Harriette Gault;

Grave Marker; R. W. Holt, September 16, 1881=August 16, 1907

The 1920 Spartanburg / Glendale Census listed the household as;
May Holt 38, head of household/widow
Son; Raymond 14
Mother; Harriet Gault 66
Brother; Alonzo Gault 40

Following the death of Roland W. Holt, Mae married J. O. Hellams.
The 1940 Spartanburg/Glendale Census listed the household as;
James O. Hellams 58, husband/mill second hand Wife Mae 58

Mae Holt Hellams died and is buried in the [Glendale Community Cemetery](#);
Grave marker; Mae Holt Hellams, 1880=1948
No record of J.O. Hellam's status was found.

S.C. Corp. 4Reg. 3 Air Service



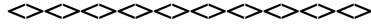
The Family of Sidney Gault Ledbetter, daughter of Rev. Sidney and Harriette Gault;
Sidney Gault married Dr. Frank Carver Ledbetter, Physician from North Carolina.
The 1920 Greenville Township Census listed the household as;
Frank C. Ledbetter 30, husband/Physician Wife; Sidney 25
Daughter; Harriett L. 1 month

The 1940 Greenville Township Census listed the household as;
Franklin C. Ledbetter 50, Physician Wife; Sidney 45

Obituary records show that;

Sidney Gault Ledbetter died at the age of 82 in August, 1977.

No record was found regarding the status of Franklin Carver Ledbetter.
